The war for democracy in Ukraine, life returning to pre-pandemic norms, Supreme Court nomination hearings, spring trying to sprout in spite of winter's last attempts to hang on, and the first primary season that will be guided by new redistricting maps are just some of what has our attention.

If you have seen any of the coverage on the war in Ukraine, it is difficult to not have strong emotions. It is heartening to see the pro-democracy world come together to fight this atrocity. If you are inclined to donate to help the people of Ukraine, I encourage you to be careful where you send those dollars. There are many organizations that are worthy of your support.
