NYSARA Annual Convention By Jeanne Williams Bennett, RC 12 past president

The annual NYSARA (New York State Alliance for Retired Americans) Convention was held on August 8, 2024, at NYSUT Headquarters in Latham, NY. The goal of the Alliance for Retired Americans (ARA) is to obtain a secure retirement for all.

NYSUT President Melinda Person welcomed the attendees. She stated that retirees will soon make up 40% of NYSUT membership. She distributed an AFT Special Resolution protecting seniors at the national level. It is now going to the AFL-CIO.

The keynote speaker was David Simon, Legislative Director for the ARA. Steve Madaracz, NYSARA Executive Director, gave an excellent presentation "Maintaining Your Online Sanity This Election Season".



NYSARA President Barry Kaufmann gave an in-depth presentation entitled "Senior Issues and the 2024 Election. If You're Not Concerned, Think Again". Social Security, Medicare, Medicaid, and prescription drugs are all on the ballot this year. In addition, Barry highlighted four points in Project 2025 which

- *Outlaws all public unions
- *Fires all Civil Service employees and replaces them with political appointees at all levels
- *Abolishes the US Department of Education
- *Makes Medicare Advantage the default enrollment option for new enrollees.

Barry urged us to vote the issues that are critical in our lives and to know how the candidates voted on important senior issues or their positions on them. For detailed information, go to www.newyorkstateara.org





Fall is here. The days feel shorter, sunset comes earlier, and there are mass numbers of political ads on tv, radio, in the mail, and on signs around town. This year, more than ever before, there is a lot on the line. I know that I have said this before, but I believe this bears repeating; NYSUT supports candidates of both parties. The test in determining who NYSUT supports is to determine who supports the issues that NYSUT cares about most. Who supports workers' rights, education, health care, and human rights for all people? I encourage you to seriously consider which issues are most important to you, then find the candidates who most closely advocate for those issues. Don't just believe what you hear others say, investigate and check the candidates' websites. When reading their posted information, ask yourself if the statements make sense, are they realistic, and is there a plan to achieve the stated goals? I advocate this for all levels of government. After a meeting not too long ago, a member relayed to me that they thought the meeting was too political. I explained that if we are being political, it is because the issues being discussed are of great importance to us and because there is a lot on the line. This year, there are ideas being advocated that will reduce or eliminate Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid as we know these programs now. Candidates will say that they want to keep these programs, but if you

Volunteer through the NYSUT PAC (Political Action Committee) or call the offices of your chosen candidates. Volunteer to make calls, write postcards, meet with other retirees or friends and family and tell them why you are supporting your chosen candidates. If it's possible, make a monetary contribution to the campaign(s) of your chosen candidate(s). When you are asked, "What have you done to stand up for democracy and your rights?", how will you answer?
